

Exclusive Use & Special Purpose Areas for the Purpose of Clause 13.

a) Maribyrnong River- special light provisions
 A Recreational Vessel-
 (i) used for training or competition; and
 (ii) is not powered but is propelled by using oars or paddles; on the waters of the Maribyrnong River upstream of the Designated Port of Port Phillip to the Canning Street Bridge shall exhibit between sunset and sunrise -

(i) a light in accordance with Rule 25 of the International Rules for Preventing Collisions at Sea, 1972; or
 (ii) a fixed 180 degree white light located on the bow of the vessel and a flashing 180 degree light on the stern of the vessel.

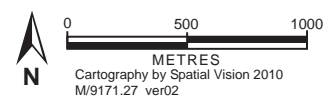

State Rules: Unless otherwise specified in a Schedule, a person must not operate a vessel on any inland waters at a speed exceeding 5 knots - (a) within 50 metres of the waters edge; or (b) within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water - except in an access lane.
